

Andalucía Day

The day of Andalucía is held on the 28 of February to commemorate the February 28, 1980 when Andalusian electorate voted for the statute that made Andalusia an autonomous community of Spain.

We talked to Ms. Loles Gámez about how the school was going to celebrate it this year and this is what she told us: "On Friday the 24 of February there shall be a Music/Poetic Recital at 10:30 in the SUM. Later that day, a Carnival Competition and last but not least a tapas tasting, all related to the olives that are the symbol of Andalucía."

"Thursday the 1 of March is going to be a busy busy day, starting off with a lecture by D. Daniel Robles García, on Olive Cultivation: tradition and evolution for first and third years. Then, afterwards, another talk by D. Lope Ruiz Lopez on the health and nutritional value of olive oil for second and fourth years. Later on, another talk will take place on olive cultivation: "Traditional Methods versus New Technology", and at 11:30 an Andalusian Lunch courtesy of various Olive Oil Cooperatives. At midday, there will be a Workshop Making Cosmetic Soap and Tooth Paste out of olive oil, there'll also be an Exhibition of Photographs and Tools related to Olive Picking."

"On Friday the 2 of March, there will be a Professional Orientational Talk for all fourth years and later on at 10:30 an Olive Oil Workshop."

The day of Andalucía shall carry on to be celebrated as it is something that unites the whole of Andalucía.
